# MVUSD BALLET FOLKLÓRICO TRYOUT PACKET

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## What to Expect

The MVUSD Ballet Folklórico Club will build and nurture character, integrity, diligence and honesty in every dancer. As a dancer in this club, students will represent the Murrieta Valley Unified School District in everything they do. Therefore, members will be held to a higher standard of conduct than other students. Your roll will include, but is not limited to, the following:

- Promoting the Mexican Heritage Arts and Culture at all sites and events
- Performing at rallies, shows and special events
- Being a positive influence to each other and to the younger aspiring members

The conduct of Ballet Folklórico members is closely observed by many, and it is important that dancers conduct themselves in a manner that not only is above reproach but models our culture and traditions to honor ourselves and our community. This handbook will provide you with a more in-depth overview of the activities, responsibilities and expectations involved with being a dancer in our club. Although we are not a sports program or an academic class, please be sure that both you and your parents read through and understand the entire handbook.

#### **Eligibility**

BF Dance Members must maintain a 2.5 GPA to participate in shows. If at the end of a grading period a dancer falls below a 2.5 GPA, they will be placed on academic probation for the following grading period. The dancer has 5 school days once grades are submitted to get a grade change through communication with teacher/registrar.

#### **Tryout Process**

- Dancers must undergo tryouts in order to be considered part of folklórico shows.
- A judging panel makes the final decision on the results of tryouts and placements.
- The advisor(s) determines the size and divisions of Beginning and Advanced levels.

## **Clearance & Field Trip Forms**

All dancers must meet clearance requirements which include a physical exam and proof of insurance according to the MVUSD Athletic Code. Signed Field Trip clearances are required to be a part of Monday practices, Saturday Workshops and shows.

#### **Transportation**

In the event that Ballet Folklórico uses school transportation or private transportation, all members MUST ride the bus **to and from** the event. Members will return to the school and the bus and may be picked up from there. Members must follow all of the rules posted in the bus. All district/school rules and regulations apply. Inappropriate conduct on any bus is prohibited. Any infraction will result in disciplinary measures determined by the Advisor.

#### **Time Commitment**

The term of membership for all dance members is from the date of election to the end of the school year the following June. By committing to Ballet Folklórico, our dancers are making Ballet Folklórico their primary activity. This means that if there are any conflicting events, obligations to the Ballet Folklórico Calendared Activities (practices, fundraisers, performances and events) ALWAYS comes first.

Although we always promote involvement in multiple sports and activities, we encourage dancers to NOT overbook themselves. Dancers with **prior** approval from advisor may have an option of transferring into another activity with the advisor **as soon as** dancer learns about placement into an advanced class and/another program such as drama **as soon as** the student learns of making the alternate team/play and can return to folklórico if the student maintains an open line of communication with the advisor, and maintains eligibility. All dancers must keep in contact with advisor(s) and keep current with practices and events. Disappearing during the first or second semester will result in the removal from folklorico.

#### **Conduct**

Dancers are to treat all teachers, advisors, administrators, and parents with respect at all times. Dancers shall respect one another's opinions and shall not be disrespectful towards or humiliate or hurt another student, dancer or advisor. Dancers shall not smoke use drugs, drink alcoholic beverages, or use unbecoming language. BF Dance Members will lift one another up positively, be patient, kind, courteous and diplomatic when an issue should arise, then communicate with advisor or administration immediately.

#### **PDA**

We are always emulating honor and tradition. Public Displays of Affection are not allowed while at any practices or events.

#### 3 Strike Disciplinary Policy

To ensure accountability and maintain the integrity of our levels, the 3 Strike disciplinary policy will be enforced. This policy is to address and correct behavioral issues in a fair and consistent manner. BF Dancers and their parents are encouraged to review and understand the expectations outlined below.

#### Strike 1:

- 1. A verbal warning will be issued to the dancer, and the incident will be documented.
- 2. A meeting may be scheduled with the dancer and advisor to review expectations and reinforce this policy.
- 3. Parents/Guardians will be notified of the incident and any necessary corrective actions.

#### Strike 2:

- 1. A written warning will be issued to the dancer, detailing the nature of the incident and previous corrective actions.
- 2. The dancer may face temporary suspension from practices or events.
- 3. A mandatory meeting with the athlete, parent/guardian and advisor will be notified of the incident and any necessary corrective actions.

#### Strike 3:

- 1. Removal from the Ballet Folklórico Club may occur upon the third incident.
- 2. The decision will be at the discretion of the coach and school administration considering the severity and circumstances of the incident(s).
- 3. Written documentation of all prior warnings and disciplinary actions will be reviewed before a final decision is made, and a mandatory meeting with the BF dancer, parent/guardian, advisor(s) and Disciplinary Administrator will be required to address the issue.

#### **Concern Procedure**

Please adhere to this structure when raising any concerns:

First address your concern or complain directly with the advisor. Many issues can be resolved at this stage.

If you remain unsatisfied, escalate the matter by contacting the Ballet Folklórico advisor(s) responsible for overseeing the club.

Should the previous steps fail to resolve your concern, you may then schedule an appointment with your Dean of Discipline. Both the Dean and the Principal will not meet with parents unless the aforementioned steps have been taken.

#### Removal from Folklórico

Depending on the severity and occurrence of the incident, the Advisor reserves the right to determine the appropriate action to take which can include dismissal from folklórico. If a BF Dance member has been dismissed from folkórico due to disciplinary actions, they will be disqualified to try out the following year. Any dance member who quits or does not complete a full season forfeits their right to Community Service Hours.

#### Communication

For parents: Any communication concerning your BF dancer, practices, Saturday Workshops, rallies, shows, fundraisers should be addressed directly to your advisor.

For students: Communication is always key. You need to self-advocate. Advisors are busy too so whatever you say, you should also message on Band APP to make sure your needs are heard and addressed.

#### Social Media

Ballet Folklórico now communicates using Band App for updates to our calendar, for instruction and for volunteering for those pop-up shows that were not on the Calendar at the beginning of August.

After posting the rosters for Beginning and Advanced Levels, dancers will receive an email with an invitation to Band App. Follow the directions in the email to sign up for a Band Account. Then you will have access to the Ballet Folklórico Calendar which will have access to all practice and event information. This information is also available on the website but on Band App, advisors and leaders can post updated details regarding call times and uniform specifications. Dance members are also able to and encouraged to upload any related photos or videos to the site after every practice, Saturday workshops or event. BF Dancers must "follow us" and allow us Advisors to follow you. This will be done immediately after learning level placements.

It is a private site. Only Ballet Folklórico members and parents may have access to the site. One can upload pictures, videos, rosters, payment information and have access to Calendar which cannot be viewed by the public. The Band App will be used to send out short reminders and updates to BF dancers in the form of a text message, but **no** phone numbers are displayed. It is strongly recommended that BF dancers and parents download this APP. I suggest students turn on notifications and parents turn off the notifications but monitor as needed. As in all things, be above reproach. Please make sure your language is appropriate and your comments on social media are positive. Understand that your social media sites are monitored by MVUSD but also by parents who are invested in the integrity of their dancer's experience.

#### **Ballet Folklórico Practices 2025-26**

BF dance members shall attend ALL practices. **Monday practices** for the team will begin as soon as try-outs are over mid-October. Practices are once a week. These practices are **mandatory**. #### **Saturday Workshops**

BF dance members shall attend SATURDAY Workshops scheduled by the Advisor. There are 3 per semester and they are **mandatory**. Workshops are closed to dancers and advisors only. Location: WSMS Multi-Purpose Room for both Middle and H.S.

The time spent at these workshops is both intentional and invaluable since we have more time, we pay for an instructor, and we learn about our new regions adopted for the year on these days.

#### **Volunteering at Impromptu Events**

For all students the possibility of performing more depends on the dancer's responsibility of being prepared for practice, their effort and drive, and improvement which is often honed at each documented event that randomly pop up. If an event is posted and we ask for volunteers, then everyone is invited to respond and depending on what everyone knows, we organize regional groups and numbers and provide a show for each venue. Learn as much as you can and be ready to jump in and get some dance experience.

Volunteering is one of the ways that students can improve their skills. If a dancer wants to diversify the region and numbers they know, dancers usually communicate what they want to dance on the Band App and if you know the number and an advisor has seen you perform it well then you can perform. We always want you to shine. You will not be told NO, but we may be limited to the number of wardrobe available per region. We encourage you to dance as much as possible and enjoy the club. Volunteering at a smaller venue like these has a different performance ready time.

#### **Fundraising**

Fundraising is a **mandatory** component of the Ballet Folklórico Club. Funds earned are always to purchase, maintain and or replenish our wardrobe. All students will be expected to sell once a semester.

#### Reaching out to Businesses

We have a letter for students to take to business establishments where one can ask for donations to the club or individual sponsorship. We will write a thank you letter and provide the business advertisement in our Playbill. All students will receive a letter and a list of suggested businesses to approach, and we hope that you can help us find a sponsor.

#### Wardrobe

Our club has always provided students with the wardrobe per region and we now proudly maintain a wardrobe for the following regions: Aguascaliente, Azteca, Baja, Chiapas, Chihuahua, Colima, Guerrero, Jalisco, Michoacan, Nayarit, Nuevo Leon, Oaxaca, Puebla, Revolución, Sinaloa, Tabasco, Tamaulipas Norte, Veracruz, Yucatan and Zacatecas.

#### Shoes

We recommend buying the black folklórico shoes first. If you plan on continuing to dance with us for 2-3 years, then you will need to invest in another white folklórico shoe and a white Adelita folklórico boot. The following regions wear this color shoe/boot when we dance in regional on stage:

If you place in the region by way of an audition, then you are **required** to purchase the shoe to dance in the upcoming event/show. A way students can earn the money to purchase their shoes without making it a financial burden on the family is to sell more of our fundraiser (duros). This is a quick and easy way to obtain the money and there are a few times a year that we will fundraise for our club. The sooner you can get yourself fit for the shoe, the better you will master the 5 basic steps of folklórico.

#### **Cultural Expectations**

In folklórico, there is an expectation that, when in wardrobe, you represent the region to the tee. You could be representing the region from anybody in the audience and they recognize that the wardrobe is accurate- if one is sloppy or spot on. It is a point of pride to wear these cultural vestments we call wardrobe and to do it well. Stay in wardrobe. Guys, keep your hats on. Girls, nothing off the shoulder. You are a role model. Smile and wear your wardrobe with pride.

#### **Accountability**

Plan ahead of time. You will NOT perform if you are missing any of these following items:

G: Camisole, Bloomers, Pantyhose, Make Up, Hair DONE, Earrings ON, and BF Shoes.

B: Hat, Tie or a Belt

#### **Practice Ready**

Plan ahead. Bring a duffle bag to school and dress out in our <u>required</u> practice ready uniform. We dress in a school appropriate black t-shirt and black shorts or leggings, black folklórico shoes for practices. We meet at 4 p.m. in the dance room across from the pool at Vista Murrieta, Room A164. If you are hungry, bring a healthy snack and water. Put your hair in a bun as described below and be <u>on time</u>. No make up is needed for practice.

#### **Hair**

BF dancers must have their hair up in a HIGH bun at the start of each practice. You must have your hairnet over the bun and your matching ribboned bun-braid on top of your hair and hairnet. The definition of high bun means that the center of the bun needs to be above the ears. No bangs.

#### Stage Make -Up

G: Foundation, Blush, Eye Shadow, Eyeliner, Mascara (or Fake Eyelashes) & Red Lipstick Stage make-up is meant to be dramatic so it can be seen by the audience.

B: Foundation to keep the shine from your forehead and the skin for an even tone.

#### **Spirit Ready**

On days that you collectively decide to dress up on your campus site, wear your BF T-shirt, black pants and jacket, comfortable shoes, and wear your hair in a bun, net and hairpiece.

## **Rally Ready**

On rally days, take your duffle bag to school to look professional and to keep yourself organized. If the rally is in the early morning, you may arrive professionally dressed but ALWAYS bring your duffle bag. You will be excused from the rallies 1 hour early to dress, unless given an arrival time that is different from your school's leadership. Then when you

are dressed, you report straight to the gymnasium to rehearse on ASB/USB's schedule. After the rally, you have 30 minutes to return your wardrobe to your advisor in the wardrobe bag you received it in.

#### **Attendance & Absences & The Point Based Merit System**

Common Absence Procedure is that BF dance members must send an email to Advisor or private Band App message to the Advisor stating the date, event and the reason for the absence. You should cc, and or duplicate your message to inform your council member in charge of the region as well. Students will earn 5 points for every practice event. For this reason, it is important to sign into 5 Star.

The following shows the amount of points deducted for:

Absences from a show can affect the choreography of a performance and this affects your peer's confidence and well-being.

Common Excused Absences: Illness/Injury, unexpected emergency, a previously approved school activity, religious obligations, approved preplanned vacations by Advisor with advanced notice.

Medical notes must be signed by a **doctor,** and this will excuse students from participating with no point loss or requirement to make up activities. This must be given to your Advisor and if it is injury related - please report it to the health office.

Common Unexcused Absences: Any absence that does not follow the absence procedure, work, vacation without 1-month advanced notice, not having a ride, sleeping in, or a non-communication with advisor about an absence will be deemed unexcused.

If a dancer is absent from school during the day of a performance, regardless of if it is an excused absence, the dancer may not participate in the show but is expected to come to the event and donate their time selling Pinwheels (Duros) at our concessions.

Clean up after yourselves. Did we leave the place cleaner than when we got there?

Help others. Do not be in such a hurry to leave.

Make sure you have checked- in all your wardrobe & accessories before your excused.

Turn in your wardrobe to your Advisor(s).

#### **Behind The Stage**

Be quiet behind the stage. Walk. Do not run. The audience can hear you.

Quiet in the ALLEY. Do not talk outside of the Drama Room or Near the Stage Door.

- G. I will always abide by the practice and event dress code.
- H. I will not chew gum at any time during practice or performances.
- I. I will not take part in any gossip or negative conversation about another Ballet Folklórico member, member of another team, coach, teacher, administrator or student (and this includes conversations in person, phone/text, email, social media, APPs, etc).
- J. I understand that my commitment to the Ballet Folklórico Club is year-long, and my lack of commitment affects my peers.
- K. I and my parents/guardians have read and understand the entire BF Handbook and accept the rules, regulations and responsibilities outlined.
