In April, we'll be gearing up for the California Assessment of Student Performance and Progress. (CAASPP). Our third through fifth grade students will be taking the assessment this year, beginning on April 14th. This assessment is much shorter than it was in the past. Please make sure to read teacher newsletters regarding important dates.

Beginning May 12th, our kindergarten through fifth grade students will complete iReady testing in English Language Arts and Math. We need our students to take the test seriously. The assessments will be completed in their current learning environment or in a small group setting.

The iReady/CAASPP assessments will be taken online with teachers and Intervention staff as proctors. Just like class assignments and report cards, these assessments give teachers a way to evaluate individual student achievement. They will provide important feedback about your child 's strengths and areas where they may need additional support.

Please make sure your child is not overly anxious about the assessment or the results. It is important that your child is at school and on time for the testing sessions. Please also make sure they are well rested and have had a good breakfast.

We look forward to finishing out this school year strong. Thank you to our students, parents, and staff, for all your support in making Monte Vista Elementary the best! Have an amazing Spring break!



Month of the MILITARY CHILD





Problem-Solving Steps



SECOND STEP FOCUS: PROBLEM SOLVING SKILLS

In Second Step, students are learning how solve interpersonal problems. Students have practiced how to calm strong emotions as an integral part to problem solving. Students are learning how to describe a problem, identify the wants and needs of others, think of solutions, explore the outcomes of potential solutions, and finally picking the best solution. This unit's content helps students ask, listen, and empathize with all parties involved during problem-solving.
