### A message from our superintendent....

#### Our commitment to ALL students and their families

We want to take this opportunity to reaffirm our commitment: All students in Murrieta Valley USD are safe, supported, and learning every day. Our unwavering dedication to serving every student in our schools is a cornerstone of what makes Murrieta Valley USD an exemplary CA district.

Long-standing Board Policies (1250) & (5145.13), and Administrative Regulations (1250) & (5145.13) safeguard our learning environment from outside visitors. Additionally, student privacy is protected under the Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act (FERPA), a federal law that prohibits the release of student information, including educational records, without consent of a parent/guardian. These protections are also reinforced by the California Education Code (EC 49060 et seq.) and shared with all families in the Annual Notification document digitally noticed at the beginning of every school year. Protecting the confidentiality and personal information of all members of our community is a fundamental priority.

Our commitment is clear: All students and their families are welcome here and will be treated with respect and dignity.

#### **CAASPP State Testing**

CAASPP State testing for grades 3, 4, and 5 at Monte Vista Elementary will begin after April 7, 2025, and continue through May 2, 2025. Fifth-grade students will also complete their science assessments after May 2. In preparation, classes will participate in practice assessments to familiarize students with the testing format. Please encourage your child to do their best and remind them that these assessments help measure their learning progress. A good night's sleep and a healthy breakfast can go a long way in supporting their success.

#### **Summative ELPAC Testing**

Summative ELPAC testing for students designated as English Learners is ongoing and will continue throughout the remainder of the year. This assessment measures the growth of our English Learners in the areas of Reading, Writing, Speaking, and Listening. The results help us better support our students in their English language development. Thank you for encouraging your child to do their best.

## When is sick too sick for school?

A regular attendance routine is important for your child's wellbeing and learning. These tips can help you decide when to keep your child home when they don't feel well.



These tips are <u>guidelines</u> as to when a student should be kept at home. This list is not inclusive of all conditions or reasons a student may need to be kept home.



#### **SEND ME TO SCHOOL IF...**

 I have NOT had a fever overnight and have NOT taken fever reducing medicine during that time.



#### **KEEP ME AT HOME IF...**

- I have a temperature higher than 100.4
- I am repeatedly coughing, wheezing, or experiencing other upper respiratory symptoms.
- I have a rash of unknown cause all over or it is accompanied by a fever.
- I have thrown up two or more times in the past 24 hours.
- My stool is watery and I may not make it to the bathroom in time.

If you don't know whether to send your child to school, have specific concerns regarding your child's physical or mental health, or are worried your child will spread illness, contact your child's health care provider, a local urgent care or the school nurse. These tips are not meant to take the place of local health department/school district health guidance including about contagious illnesses such as Covid-19 and the flu.


